Have a great week. Remember the door is 'nearly' always open for a chat!



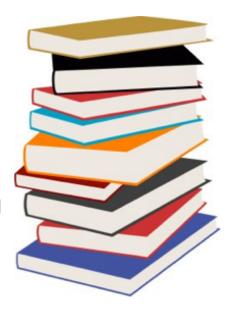


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Library Books! Library Books! Calling All Library Books!
